Paul has developed highly effective working relationships with a wide range of stakeholders, including prison staff at all levels, National Careers Service, Novus, Prison job club and NEPACS. He has skilfully used these relationships to make the CFO3 contract a valued and highly respected programme, viewed as an essential mechanism to engage and develop the hardest to help individuals.

Paul regularly attends stakeholder meetings within the prison environment, such as QIGs and RRIGs, where his knowledge and expertise about ETE activity is highly valued and respected. He accesses unemployed lists to target those individuals who are excluded from the regimes, where he engages them within meaningful activity. Paul has worked tirelessly in promoting APM's specialist supply chain partners across various prison departments, so that their roles are understood and valued. He facilitates and coordinates all supply chain interventions so that prisoners receive the regular and appropriate support needed. He has also liaised with external training partners so that accredited learning outside of the core curriculum can be delivered to CFO beneficiaries, such as FLT and health and safety (CSCS).
